Our country had gone through a very tough phase recently, particularly on account of the Covid II wave. It has been very brutal & painful and affected a large section of our population very badly. We all know about a large number of casualties due to this pandemic, especially in the month of April and May. Many families have lost their main breadwinner, kids have lost their parents, families are in financial trouble, etc.

In such times, CRKMCT is trying its best to support Covid affected families all over the country. We have launched few schemes like **Sustainable Support Initiative (SSI) -Covid Relief, Ration kit Distribution to needy families. Under SSI, the trust is aiding** families who have lost their main earning members due to Covid and are in poor financial condition, anywhere in the country. Trust has been giving them immediate financial help, plus it will provide long-term education support for their kids. **If you know any such family, please refer to our trust.**

Ration kit distribution is meant for very poor families who have been living under pathetic conditions and are not able to manage two meals a day. We have distributed more than 250 ration kits in Jaipur, Dausa, Ajmer, and Bassi Taluka, near Jaipur.

During due diligence of our existing beneficiaries through video call, we experienced that family income has reduced substantially either due to job loss or business closure or pay cut or reduced self business. Health expense has increased in many of the cases. Further, the closure of schools and colleges has disrupted the study schedule of students. It was not easy to adjust to the online mode of teaching, and many of our beneficiary families had to borrow money to buy gadgets for this new teaching method. It has also increased their financial burden.

But the positive and the most inspiring part during this due diligence process was the resilience of parents/ families to educate their children whatever may be the condition, and kids are doing their best to adjust and learn through the new digitalized ways. Keeping in view the present tough situation, CRKMCT has been providing higher scholarship support compared to earlier years to its beneficiaries for their education. We request you to work hard, remain positive and stay on your course to achieve your long-term goals.



FIRST QUARTER REPORT (APRIL – JUNE 2021)

1. SCHOLARSHIP DISTRIBUTION

A total of around Rs. 22.76 lacs were distributed as scholarships. We have supported **223 beneficiaries** under various schemes in this quarter. In the year 2020-21, more than Rs 80 lakhs were disbursed to around 900 beneficiaries.

We had organized a virtual meeting to get connected with these beneficiaries. We shared trust philosophy, guiding principles, and various new programs of the trust with all attendees.

Dr.Pramod Joshi, a trustee, motivated all these students to become multifaceted personalities by participating in sports, extra-curricular activities, etc., apart from acquiring academic excellence. Major D Routella (Retd) from Haldwani and Prof. Bhagwan Bisht from Kumaon joined as special guests. Major Routella shared his army experience and after retirement work for the widows of martyrs. Prof. Bisht shared his education experience with students and guided them to develop value-based life. All three of them shared their humble beginnings and tough life and exhorted students not to give up any time in the journey of life.

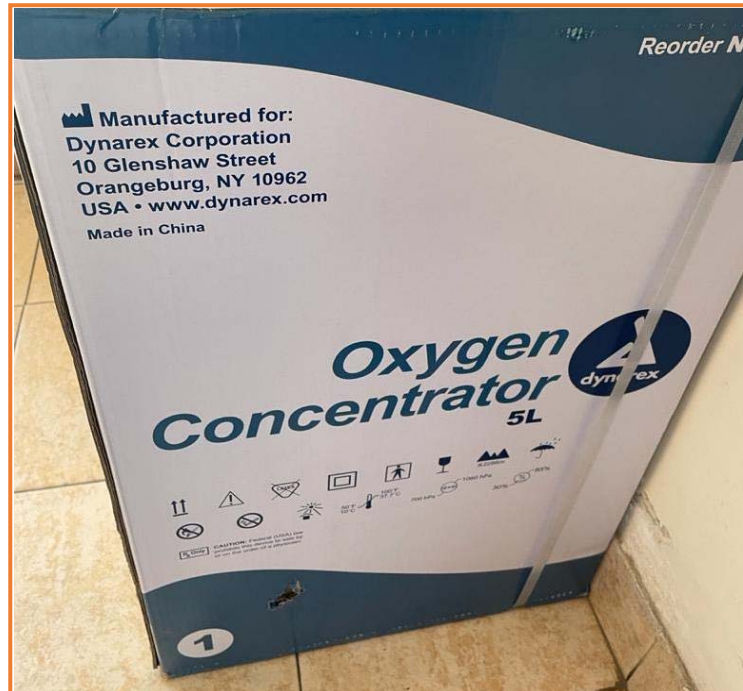

I am Nimesh Chaudhari. I have completed my Bachelor of Engineering in Electronics & Instrumentation from MSU, Baroda. Currently, I am working as an ASIC Verification Engineer in Arastu Systems, Ahmedabad.

I belong to a lower-middle-class family consisting of my parents and my elder brother. My father is a tailor, and my mother is a housewife. Both my parents are not much educated but always wanted to give their children a good education. Our tuition teacher was teaching both of us in half fees till class 10th. My brother completed 10th class with flying colours securing 86% in the board examination in the year 2008. I had just entered class 10. My father wanted my brother to opt for the Science stream, but the fee was beyond his reach. We then visited the C. R. Kothari Memorial Charitable Trust office and submitted the form. After that, Sanjay Sir, his mother, and Archana madam visited us. They assured us of initiating not only the scholarship of my brother but my scholarship as well. That is how my journey with trust began.

I completed class 10th with 91% and chose the science stream as suggested by the trust. I passed 12th Science in 2011 with 89% marks and got admission in Electronics Engineering at MSU. Since the college fee was only INR 1500/- we requested that the trust should only bear our tuition fee. Trust also provided us a computer for project work and an English-Gujarati dictionary to improve our vocabulary. In the 7th semester, I wasn't able to arrange the fees and contacted trust office. Trust office immediately paid my fees. Trust has always been like a pillar of support for us, always there whenever we are in need. I am also thankful for the Personality Development classes by Neogi Sir, which helped me groom my personality.

I have come a long way, and with five years of experience, I am doing well in my career. My family has moved into a duplex from a one-room kitchen. All this wouldn't have been possible without trust's support.

I am now working as a committee member in the Ahmedabad and Baroda chapter of the trust. I feel blessed to contribute to the trust.
